Police review death of Adelaide accountant

South Australia Police on Monday, 19/06/2017 19:43 AEST

SA Police have released further details about the unsolved 1988 murder of Adelaide accountant Samuel Hayward as part of an ongoing cold case campaign called Operation Persist.

Police say new technology has enabled more forensic material to be gathered in relation to the active investigation.

"Advances in technology have provided police with new forensic material that is now being examined," Detective Brevet Sergeant Shane Przibilla, a criminal investigator with the SA Police Major Crime Investigation Branch, said.

Further information about a man seen in company with Mr Hayward on the night of his murder has also been released as police seek assistance from the community to further the inquiry.

Mr Hayward's death was caused by a series of violent blows to his head with a dumbbell, which was found next to his body.

The 46-year-old who lived alone and was not in a relationship at the time of his death, was found in his Kingston Park unit on Tuesday, 22 November 1988.

Expert medical opinion suggests that he was killed two days earlier either on the evening of Saturday 19 November or on Sunday, 20 November.

On Saturday, police understand Mr Hayward had lunch with a man and then returned to his home with him.

His companion is described as being a short, well-presented, dark haired Caucasian man in his mid to late twenties at the time, so he would now be in his late 50s. It is understood he spoke with an accent.

Mr Hayward trained as a priest in New South Wales and police believe he may have met this man through his New South Wales connections.

After the murder, the man is believed to have stolen the victim's vehicle, wallet and credit cards as well as other personal possessions.

Police enquiries established that Mr Hayward's credit cards were used after his death in Victoria and New South Wales to purchase fuel and accommodation, with his vehicle and some possessions later recovered in Wollongong by New South Wales police.

A single, unidentified fingerprint belonging to a possible suspect was found in the bathroom of the property and police now also have located blood that is believed to belong to the suspect.

Fingerprint examinations later matched a print in the recovered vehicle and one on a credit card voucher to the one found in the victim's bathroom.

"We're confident we will get a result," Detective Brevet Sergeant Przibilla said.

Operation Persist, led by Major Crime, is reviewing a number of unsolved murder and long-term, suspicious missing persons cases.

Police never 'close' unresolved cases of this type, with any matter unresolved after 12 months classified as a cold case.

A range of operational strategies are being used to progress cases, including detailed reviews, the provision of rewards, targeting prison inmates for information and seeking public assistance via publicity of cold cases.

Update: Armed robbery, Brighton

Cannabis crops located in Woodville Gardens

South Australia Police on Monday, 19/06/2017 13:05 AEST

A man has been arrested after two cannabis crops were located in Woodville Gardens.

At 9.30am on Saturday 17 June, officers from Serious and Organised Crime Branch searched a house in Woodville Gardens. Inside they located 14 mature cannabis plants being grown hydroponically in three purpose built grow rooms. A large amount of prescribed equipment was seized and electricity to the house had been bypassed to power the elaborate set up.

This discovery led police to a second house in Woodville Gardens where they located a further 18 plants inside 6 grow rooms. The electricity had also been tampered with at this house.

Police have since arrested a 21-year-old man from Woodville Gardens and charged him with cultivating a controlled plant, possessing prescribed equipment and diverting electricity.

He was refused bail and will appear in the Port Adelaide Magistrates Court on 19 June.

Investigations are ongoing, and police have not ruled out further arrests.

Fake trader website scam claims 126 victims

State Crime Command's Financial and Cyber Crime Group are currently conducting an investigation into a number of "fake trader" websites that have claimed a significant number of Queensland victims, as a result of information provided by the Australian Criminal Intelligence Commission through the Australian Cybercrime Online Reporting Network (ACORN).

It is alleged these websites have been established to lure victims into purchasing heavily reduced priced items, including BBQS, outboard motors, air conditioners and gym equipment in return for cash payment. Victims have paid cash expecting goods to be delivered that have never arrived.

"Firstly I would like to take the opportunity to acknowledge those who have reported the matter to ACORN to allow us to investigate these matters. At this stage we have received 126 reports in relation to 27 separate websites. We anticipate somewhere in the vicinity of \$110,000 has been lost so far, however we expect this figure to rise," Acting Detective Inspector Peter Robb said.

"We believe a man and a woman who may be able to assist us with our investigation are currently in Brisbane and we are seeking the public's support on two fronts. If you have any information relating to the people pictured, we'd ask you to call Policelink. We also ask that if you have fallen victim to this type of scam or any other online scam, to report the matter to ACORN."

Police have since worked with hosting agencies to take down the websites, but are concerned there may be more websites and even more victims.

"We would also encourage the public to stay vigilant when shopping online and remember if it's too good to be true then it probably is. By shopping online at sites that you know are trusted and using established payment systems that offer buyer protection, you can protect yourself from falling victim to these scams," Acting Detective Inspector Robb said.

Breakthrough in Carly McBride murder

New South Wales Police on Monday, 19/06/2017 10:14 AEST

Police have made a breakthrough arrest in the murder case of Lake Macquarie woman, Carly McBride.

31-year-old Ms McBride, of Belmont, disappeared on Tuesday 30 September 2014, during a visit to Muswellbrook in the Hunter Valley.

Detectives from the Hunter Valley Local Area Command formed Strike Force Karabi to investigate her disappearance and conducted a series of extensive searches of bushland and properties in the Muswellbrook area.

In August last year, the remains of the mother-of-two were found in roadside scrub at Owens Gap on the outskirts of Scone.

Just after eight o'clock this morning (Monday 19 June), strike force investigators travelled to a home at San Remo on the Central Coast where they arrested a 39-year-old man in connection with the murder.

Fatal crash north-east of Albury

New images released as part of cold case Youngkin murder

Queensland Police Service on Monday, 19/06/2017 08:42 AEST

Detectives have released a number of images as part of an on-going investigation into the cold case murder of Wayne Youngkin.

An enhanced image of a car seat cover found in a septic tank along with Mr Youngkin's remains has been released, along with a new image of Wayne and a friend.

Detective Inspector Tim Trezise said it was hoped that these new images, plus the reward of \$250,000 announced today by the Police Minister today would generate new leads as the investigation continues into Mr Youngkin's murder.

"Over the past seven months, we have made several significant discoveries relating to Mr Youngkin, including the car seat covers and a watch believed to have belonged to him," Detective Inspector Tim Trezise.

"We hope that these enhanced images of the car seat covers might jog someone's memory. We are trying to find out their origin and speak with anyone who may have had those car seat covers at the time. (the 1980s)

"We are also continuing to investigate known associates of Mr Youngkin and are urging anyone who may have known him or has knowledge of his movements throughout the early to mid-1980s to come forward.

"Even if the information may seem minor to you, it could play a significant part in progressing the investigation and building a complete picture about his murder."

JOINT RELEASE – Reward offered in Wayne Youngkin murder investigation

Queensland Police Service on Monday, 19/06/2017 08:42 AEST

A \$250,000 reward for information leading to the conviction of any person responsible for the murder of Wayne Youngkin has been announced today.

Police Minister Mark Ryan approved the reward following extensive investigations into the discovery of Mr Youngkin's remains in a septic tank at Brighton in November last year.

Sgnificant items of interest including a set of brown car seat covers and a watch belonging to Wayne Youngkin were also located in the tank at the back of a North Street residence.

Minister Ryan said in addition, an appropriate indemnity from prosecution would be considered for any accomplice, not being the person who actually committed the crime, who first gives such information.

"Mr Youngkin went missing in 1986 – that's over thirty years that his family and friends have been waiting to find out what happened to him," Minister Ryan said.

"I have approved this reward in the hope that it will prompt someone out there in the community that has been sitting on information about this case for years to finally come forward.

"I want to make it clear though, that this reward will only be paid to someone who was not directly involved in the cime but may have vital information needed for police to solve this case."

Detective Inspector Tim Trezise said invesitgators were hoping the reward would encourage members of the public to come forward.

"Police are committed to solving this case, and we would urge anyone who may be assisting in keeping

the crime a secret to come forward as this is their opportunity to do so with the cance of indemnity," Detective Inspector Tresize said.

"Police currently have several avenues of investigation which may not have been possible if it weren't for the assistance of the local community providing valuable information," he said.

"We would like to hear from anyone who knew Wayne Youngkin or his movements in the early to mid 1980s, no matter how minor it may seem"

Investigators are continuing to appeal for anyone who may recognise the distinctive towlling car seat covers (pictured) or know the vehicle they belong to contact police.

Anyone with further information in relation to this matter is urged to contact Crime Stoppers on 1800 333 000.

Traffic Police have reported a scooter rider for drink driving and not wearing wearing a helmet, after he was also carrying not one but two passengers on his scooter.

Just before 5pm on Sunday 18 June, a police patrol spotted a blue scooter with three occupants travelling

north on West Terrace.

The scooter was stopped with the patrol speaking to the male rider and the two female passengers.

The rider a 34-year-old man from Millswood who only held a learner's permit for riding a motorcycle and wasn't wearing a helmet, was also breath tested allegedly returning a blood alcohol reading of 0.124 or more than double the legal limit.

He was reported for drink driving, issued a six month loss of licence and his scooter was impounded for 28 days.

The reported man will also be summonsed to appear in court at a later date.

The two passengers, one a 25-year-old woman from Prospect who wasn't wearing a helmet was issued a \$328.00 'on the spot fine' for not wearing a motorcycle helmet.

The police patrol were shocked at the driving behaviour and the risk taken but all three people, especially following recent fatal crashes involving motorcycles.

Eight riders have died on our State's road already this year compared to three at the same time last year.
