Update: Attempted murder charges, Wellington Point



CyberCrime Offences

Tasmania Police on Thursday, 23/06/2016 09:17 AEST

Police wish to advise of several sophisticated technology based crimes that are becoming more common in recent times.

There are three examples:

Finance officers at businesses are receiving emails from their 'boss' about preparing a payment. Emails are exchanged and the 'boss' provides direction as to who and how to pay the requested funds. In the last two weeks, several actual and attempted losses to business have occurred. The details of targeted people are obtained from business websites and technology is used to send an email that looks legitimate and from your 'boss'. Reports have been received from quite big businesses down to voluntary children sports groups.

A persons' bank account is compromised by a scammer. The scammer collects both personal information and the person's mobile phone number. The personal information allows the scammer to arrange for the mobile phone to be ported to another device or phone provider. The scammer then intercepts the SMS authentication code that the bank would send to the person's mobile phone for a new payer transfer. Funds are then transferred out of the bank account. Funds can then be accessed by using the phone for a cashless cash withdrawal, thus leaving no trail to follow. There are warning signs to be aware of:

(a) Your phone service is suddenly disconnected or is playing up.
